Risers Program

For Kindergarten Graduates,
Newly Enrolled or Current Elementary Students

The Riser Program will be offered 7 weeks this summer. It will begin on June 16 and continue through August 1. The Kindergarten students may attend the day camp with Mrs. Pound and Mr. Woodlee the first 2 weeks of the summer session (June 2-13).

We recommend that all new students and kindergarten graduates, who will be entering our Lower Elementary attend a minimum of 2 weeks, to facilitate a smooth transition into our Lower Elementary program. Current Elementary students who need additional help are encouraged to attend and transfer students must attend a minimum of 6 weeks.

Mrs. Sarieh and Mrs. Skelton will share the weeks teaching the Riser program. They will be working with the risers from 8:30 – 11:30 a.m., giving students extra instruction in reading, writing, math, geography and science along with creative, skill-building activities. The students will also enjoy arts and crafts projects during the morning.

The Risers will begin their day outside with the day camp. They will move into a classroom at 8:30 a.m. Risers will join Mrs. Pound, Mr. Woodlee and the day campers at 11:30 a.m. for lunch, quiet reading and a fun-filled afternoon.

The Risers will be included on the **field trips** with the day camp students. This will be a perfect blend of fun and work! We will have gardening, sprinkler days, nature walks, bicycle riding, bicycle safety, roller skating, horseback-riding, pizza, movie Fridays, picnic lunches, fire safety, and more.

Risers must attend all of Week 4 to participate in the overnight camp out. (No exceptions to this rule.) We camp on the back of the MA property with Mr. Woodlee, Mrs. Pound and many adult chaperones. We always have a great time!

Summer 2008 Guidelines

Completed forms must be returned by **Friday, April 4**, to ensure placement. Priority will be given to those registering for the full 9 week session, but children needing just a few weeks are also welcome!

Spaces in our Riser Program are reserved and limited to students registered for fall, except on a stand-by week-by-week basis. Admittance can be denied at any point during the summer that students cease to be re-enrolled for fall. Non-returning kindergarten graduates are invited to sign up for our Day Camp!

Rules & Regulations

- Tuition is due every Monday.
- Tuition received after Monday must include a \$10 late fee.
- We encourage you to pay for a few weeks at a time in order to avoid late fees.
- Reserved weeks **may be switched** if desired week is available, and advance notice is approved by Mrs. Walther.

Reserved weeks may not be dropped after April 25. If you reserve a week and find that your child cannot attend, payment must still be made. **Montessori Academy may credit your account only if BOTH of the following conditions have been met: 1) you have notified the office in advance AND 2) there is an extra (above the enrollment limit) child on the waiting list who can fill your child's space.**

Special Events!

Weekly Field Trips may include bowling, ice skating, "Pump-it-Up", Sounds baseball game, Climb Nashville, swimming, fishing, movies and more. There will be an additional charge for each event.

Community Visitors

We will invite community guests to talk with our students. This summer's guests may include police officers, fire-fighters, the Bike Rodeo, The Mounted Patrol, dental hygienist, and more.

Sports

Various sports will be offered including archery, wiffle ball, volleyball, badminton, basketball, and soccer.

Gym Shoes: All new students must purchase gym shoes (non-marking) which will be left in the gym. Please print your child's name on the back heels of his/her gym shoes. Returning students may need to purchase a new pair if they have outgrown their old shoes.

Horseback Riding/Pizza/Video Fridays

Mr. Woodlee will bring his horses (Ginger, Spirit, and Tornado) to ride and visit with the children every week. We will have pizza and movies every Friday. After having pizza for lunch, we will enjoy a carefully chosen, appropriate movie in the afternoon along with popcorn.

Water Sprinkler Days

Every Tuesday and Thursday afternoon the children will play in the water sprinklers on the basketball court. Please remember to send appropriate clothing (swimsuit, towel, and water shoes).

Camp Out

Mr. Woodlee will share lessons on camping skills during the week preceding the scheduled camp out. Children bring their tents on Monday and practice putting it up all week. The overnight camp out includes an evening cookout in the pavilion, a campfire at the campsite, followed by singing, storytelling, and breakfast at the campsite.

Requirements for camp out attendance: Students must attend all of Week 4 to be eligible to attend the camp out. Parents are invited to join us on our 23-acre wooded campus.
